Morgan 4/4 Club (started on 21st July 1951)

- 1951 ~ Advertisements in AutoSport (May), and inaugural club meeting held at Ye Olde Flying Horse, Kegworth; the report was in AutoSport (July). First Club Road Rally (August). The RAC approved recognition to hold motoring competitions. Rules of the Club approved and subscription set at £2. Club colours agreed as Light Blue, Red & Black for Badges & Club Tie.
- 1952 ~ First AGM (April), first Motoring and Morgans club magazine. First Morgan 4/4 Club President elected – Jeff Sparrowe. Occasional newsletter issued.

- 1970 ~ First large Morgan gathering at Prescott celebrating 60years of Morgan (6th/7th June), Co-Promoted with Bugatti Club. Club visit to LawrenceTune on 15th April. Derbyshire Centre held 1st meeting. Miscellany now back to A5 size with white cover issued quarterly or bi-monthly.
- 1971 ~ Membership voted change to MSCC ~ now 600 members. Real Northern Centre started, Southern Centre (ceased in 1978), and Reading (later known as Thames Valley) held 1st Meetings.
- 1972 ~ South East (HopMog), and Bristol (BogMog) Centres held 1st meeting. Series1 and Plus 4 Registers started. MSCC AGM ~ Club rules updated.
- 1973 ~ Yorkshire Centre formed (previously part of Northern Centre). Cranfield Centre, and South West (Cornwall) Group held 1st meeting.
- 1974 ~ Midland, and Warwickshire centres held 1st meeting. Attempt to start Staffordshire Centre. Real Northern Centre renamed as Durham and N East (NorMog). Harvey Postlethwaite guest speaker at Dinner Dance.
- 1975 ~ South Coast and Lincolnshire (LinMog) Centres started. Miscellany now issued on a monthly basis.
- 1976 ~ Oxford Centre (OxMog) started, and Derbyshire Centre becomes Donington (DonMog) Centre. First National Club event and 25 years of the MSCC ~ Harewood and Shelsley Walsh. Final Club Newsletter issued.
- 1977 ~ MOG77 by Warwickshire Centre ~ Ragley Hall, Warwickshire (pilot event). High Peak (TorMog) and South Wales (TaffMog) Centres start.

- 1980 ~ MOG80 by both 3 and 4 wheeler clubs ~ Beaulieu and Goodwood. Scotland Centre (JockMog) starts.
- 1981 ~ MOG81 by DonMog ~ Elvaston Castle, Derbyshire.
- 1982 ~ MOG82 by Warwickshire Centre ~ Walton Hall, Warwickshire. Wessex (ScrumpyMog) and Brighton (SexMog) Centres start.
- 1983 ~ MOG83 by Warwickshire Centre ~ Walton Hall, Warwickshire. Chas Smith elected as an MSCC Vice President
- 1984 ~ MOG84 and 75th Anniversary by MMC ~ Eastnor Castle, Herefordshire.
- 1985 ~ MOG85 by CranMog ~ 'Haycock', Wansford, Hertfordshire.
- 1986 ~ MOG86 Golden Jubilee of the 4 wheeled Morgan ~ Malvern. Staffordshire Centre formed. Arthur Neal joins Chas Smith as a Vice President.
- 1987 ~ MOG87 by NorMog ~ Beamish, Co Durham.
- 1988 ~ MOG88 by OxMog ~ Cotswolds. Cumbria Centre (FellMog) starts.
- 1989 ~ MOG89 by JockMog ~ Carrbridge, Scotland. North Wales (DevaMog) and Cornwall (TinMog) Centres formed.
- 1990 ~ MOG90 by HopMog ~ Whitbread Hop Farm, Kent.
- 1991 ~ MOG91 ~ Malvern, 40 years of MSCC and Plus4. MSCC became Ltd Company.
- 1992 ~ MOG92 by TaffMog ~ Margam, South Wales.
- 1993 ~ MOG93 by Staffordshire Centre ~ Weston Park, Shifnal.
- 1994 ~ MOG94 by Yorkshire Centre ~ City of York. Mendip Centre started. In the ' Tour du Monde' three French owners successfully drive around the world in three 1980s 4/4 CVH 4 seater Morgans – an amazing achievement.
- 1995 ~ MOG95 by New Forest Centre ~ Beaulieu.
- 1996 ~ MOG96 by Midland, Warwick and Stafford Centres ~ Himley Hall, Dudley. Miscellany now issued in A4 with cover photo.
- 1997 ~ MOG97 by Bristol Centre (BogMog) ~ Bath. Sherwood Forest, Gloucestershire (SpotMog) and Cambridgeshire (FringeMog) Centres started.
- 1998 ~ MOG98 by ManxMog ~ Isle of Man (May), and HalMog 98 (managed by Melvyn Rutter) ~ Great Hallingbury (August). Isle of Man (ManxMog) and Channel Isles (ChanMog) Centres formed.
- 1999 ~ MOG99 by JockMog ~ Bridge of Allen, Scotland.
- 2000 ~ MOG2000 by HopMog ~ Canterbury and Lydden Hill race circuit, Kent. Vice President Arthur Neal dies.
- 2001 ~ MOG01 by MMC ~ Cheltenham. MSCC Golden Anniversary. Miscellany with 56 pages and in colour. Membership now at 4400.
- 2002 ~ MOG02 ~ Gaydon Transport Museum, Warwickshire.
- 2003 ~ MOG03 by NorMog ~ Newcastle and Croft. Peter Morgan, President of the Morgan Sports Car Club dies.
- 2004 ~ MOG04 by DevaMog ~ Oswestry. Leicestershire Centre (FoxMog) started. MSCC President is now Charles Morgan.
- 2005 ~ MOGMMV ~ Gaydon Transport Museum, Warwickshire and Prescott Hill. RAC Isle of Man TT Centenary invitation to MSCC. Dixon Smith and Ray Meredith elected Vice Presidents to join Chas Smith.

- 2026 ~ 75th Anniversary of MSCC ~ Malvern & Kegworth, Leicestershire, through months of June & July.
